*Presented for the first time in 2007, this award honors a New England based individual or firm specializing in landscape architecture or design, in recognition of a long-term commitment to the use of native plants in exceptional or distinctive landscape compositions.*

### **SUBMISSION AND NOTIFICATION DATES**

All applications must be postmarked by March 1, 2012. Finalists will be notified by May 15, 2012. Finalists will be notified by May 15, 2012 to arrange garden visits by a panel of judges. Winner will be notified by August 15, 2012.

### **AWARD REQUIREMENTS and JUDGING**

This award recognizes a body of work over time. We request applicants to submit one complete project for evaluation, as well as summaries of at least two other projects. Overall quality and workmanship and creative and effective use of native plant material is of primary importance. Unusual or unique uses and plant combinations may be emphasized.

FOR THE PRIMARY PROJECT, THE FOLLOWING IS REQUIRED:

- A completed entry form.
- A typed, one-page double-spaced 12 point font description of the project including design criteria, special or unusual challenges and other relevant information.
- A maximum of 12 digital images, slides and for photos (8"x10") illustrating different aspects, views or seasons of the project. "Before and After" photos are especially helpful to the judges, as are photos taken of a project a few years after installation. Please submit duplicate images or photos, not the originals. New England Wild Flower Society is not responsible for damaged or lost materials. Number your slides or photos in the order you wish them to be viewed by the judges.
- A complete plant list which clearly indicates native woody and herbaceous plants as well as non-native inclusions.

FOR THE SECONDARY PROJECTS, a typed, one-page double-spaced 12 point font summary description should be included.

Planting plans are not required, but are encouraged. Clearly label all parts of your application. A panel of judges will visit projects of finalists before a winner is chosen.

One award will be given only if an exceptional candidate is identified.
